DRINKING FOUNTAINS SOURCES OF WORRY TO COMMISSIONERS

Considering their small size, drinking fountains cause more trouble for the public utilities department of the city than anything else under the sun, with the possible exception of reporters. For some days now the general manager has been bothered with complaints about dogs performing "physical impossibilities" and drinking at places which were only intended for human beings.

Now the department is installing a bright new fountain right in front of the office for the use of its four-footed friends and the public in general. Of course, it isn't intended that the canines should use this, but it is more or less of a concession to them, because last year right in this same spot there stood a dog-proof fountain.

The only trouble with making it "dog proof" was that it was almost "human proof" too. The fountain was installed as an experiment. As a combined shower bath and stationary street sprinkler it was a decided success, but as an honest to goodness drinking fountain its battling average was about .021. It had a patent lever which had to be operated before water was obtained and, of course no dog but a "Keystone Teddy" or some canine movie actor could manage this, and it was quite safe from that point of view. The trouble was that whenever a human being operated it there was always a near drowning accident. The water flowed forth copiously and clearly demonstrated that the pressure in this part of the city was up to snuff. Even some of the dignified members of the utilities commission had narrow escapes.

Naturally after playing funny tricks on the utilities commissioners the fountain was doomed. Today it was dug up and respectable little "bubbler" was put in its place.

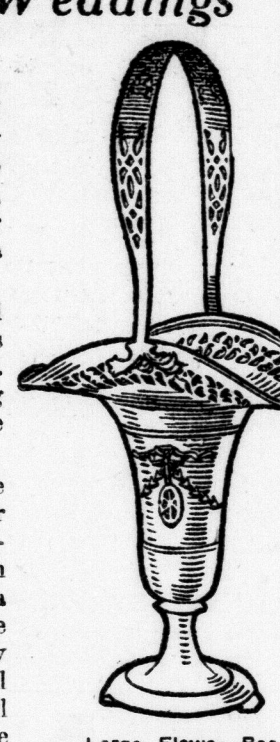

BIRD NOTES

(Contributed by McIlwraith Ornithological Club.)

The continued backward weather and particularly the cold nights have caused a lull in the movement of birds. Very few new species have been noted recently, and those which have arrived are not present in large numbers. The warmer weather and the accompanying increased growth in vegetation, for the state of development of birds, flowers and leaves is closely related to bird migration.

One of the new arrivals is Lincoln's Sparrow, a bird somewhat resembling the Song Sparrow, but with more of an olive tinge to the back, and with finer streaks on the breast and sides. A buffy band across the breast also serves as a distinguishing mark. It is a quiet, unobtrusive and rather rare little fellow, and one that is not often heard in song. It is therefore easy to overlook and its recording always gives us a feeling of satisfaction.

The Wood Pewee arrived on the 17th exactly on time. This is a bird of the city and may be heard along our avenues and in the parks even during the summer days when bird voices are seldom noticed. It is one of the Flycatcher family and has received its name from its rather plaintive call "Pee-wee, Pee-a-wee."

The speed at which birds fly is always a subject of much speculation, but the other morning we had an opportunity to judge the rate of a pair of Great Blue Herons with some degree of accuracy. These birds never seem to be going very fast, their big wings flapping lazily but they easily overtook our car and sailed left us far behind, as they flew into the rays of the morning sun. As we were travelling at some 20 or 21 miles per hour, the Herons must have been going at least 40, which seems quite fast for such large ungainly birds. E. M. S. DALE.
