REDUCED POSTAGE TO JAMAICA.

OTTAWA, Dec. 1.-There will be a reduction in the rate of postage on parcels between Canada and Jamaica, from 20 to 12 cents per pound, the limit of weight for one parcel being 11 pounds. The postage rate on parcels passing between Canada and Trinidad has also been reduced from 16 to 12 cents per pound, with a similar weight limit. The reduced rates come into effect on Jan. 1.
