Premier Drury's Campaign in Address to Halton Electors Germany's Advance Toward Bankruptcy Reaches Critical Stage

"NEHEMIAH" DRURY BUILDS UP LEGISLATIVE JERUSALEM WITH ONE EYE ON "TOBLIAH" DEWART

Premier Opens Halton Campaign With Detailed Exposition of Farmers' Idea on Patronage, Party Politics and Education — Gives Raney Credit.

Oakville, Jan. 29.—H. H. Dewart and Howard Ferguson were likened by Premier Drury tonight to Tobiah, the Ammonite, and Sanballat, against whom Nehemiah, the builder of Jerusalem, held his weapons in hand while working. Inferentially the Farmers' government, having undertaken the erection of a legislative Jerusalem in Queen's Park, should be given a chance to proceed with the task without interference.

Mr. Drury declared himself no professional politician, but said he had undertaken to lead the legislature because government must proceed. If chaos must result, the coalition had no fear of a general election.

Elvin G. Farrow, the wealthy young local farmer, who arranged that John E. Ford, the U. F. O. member for Halton, step aside for Mr. Drury, presided and at the beginning and end of the meeting deprecated the idea of a by-election contest.

POLICE ARREST MINING BROKER

Stanley Vickery Alleged to Have Purloined Clients' Money.

Stanley Vickery, aged 30, of Vickery & Co., mining brokers, 56 West King street, was arrested last night by Detective Sergt. Elliot and Mulholland on a charge of theft.

Vickery is alleged to have stolen \$65 from S. C. Hall, 69 St. Andrew street, based on the complaint of alleged victims, the police believe that Vickery's defalcations will amount to approximately \$40,000.

The arrest of Vickery was subsequent to the complaint of a number of these alleged creditors, who called at the detective department yesterday afternoon, and Elliot and Mulholland were dispatched to his place of business.

When they arrived they found twenty or thirty of the complainants assembled, waiting for the appearance of Vickery. They had held an assignation meeting previous to going to his office and were ready for the broker when he arrived.

The officers located Vickery at 78 West King street and placed him under arrest on the specific charge of theft.

Vickery is alleged to have been entrusted with considerable amounts of money by people who wished to invest in mining stocks, and is said to have failed to deliver the stock. The complainants claim that all they received was a check for the money they invested, as the law requires the demand to come from the railways.

Legislators Protest Restriction of Passes

Ottawa, Jan. 29.—(Special).—Provincial legislators are protesting against the railway act which restricts their passes to their province. The railway commission has been approached to have a national instead of provincial passes issued to the provincial legislators.

The railway commission will not act on the application of the legislators as the law requires the demand to come from the railways.

EIGHT ARE INJURED IN AN EXPLOSION

Ignited Chemicals Wreck Building in New Toronto Factory.

Eight persons were injured last evening when two coating machines exploded in the plant of the Canadian Fabrikoid Co., Ltd., New Toronto at 5.45 o'clock. The explosion is believed to have been caused by a spark falling into one of the machines and the building was almost entirely wrecked and the damage is estimated at approximately \$25,000.

The building in which the explosion occurred was one of twelve brick buildings, all of which stand separate from one another and sheathed with galvanized iron. At the time of the explosion only eight workmen were engaged in the building, all of whom were severely burned by exploding chemicals. The names of four of the injured were John German, John Rodie, John Spent, Donald Leavey.

These John German was admitted to the General Hospital and is in a serious condition as a result of his injuries.

The fire, which broke out as a result of the explosion, was not finally extinguished until 8 p.m., when it was confined to the one building by the New Toronto fire force, which hastily arrived on the scene.

The plant is composed of twelve separate one-story brick buildings, all standing apart from one another, so that the explosion did not damage them to any extent beyond breaking the glass in those nearest the one in which it occurred. The company uses large amounts of high explosives in the manufacture of auto tops, gramophone records, comb sets, and it is into a machine containing gun cotton that the spark is thought to have fallen. The plant employs altogether 350 men.

PILE OF RELIEF FOOD ARE ROTTING AT DANZIG

New York, Jan. 29.—The American relief administration today notified the state department that thousands of packages of food sent by persons in America to starving relatives and friends in South, Central and Eastern Europe have been rotting in huge piles in Danzig since last summer.

There is no prospect, it added, of the goods reaching their destinations. Cable messages received from the administration's Warsaw representative said that the loss of food and money would total "hundreds of thousands of dollars."

NEMESIS OVERTAKES AUSTRIAN "REDS" FOR ILLEGAL DEATH OF ANTI-BOLSHEVISTS

Prague, Jan. 28.—Three communists were executed this morning, making a total of 27 so far. All were tried, and it was shown that they were a responsible for murders. Two of the three, named Pergovic and Terebo, as Red Guards, carried out the orders of Bela Kun and shot two Ukrainian officers and robbed them of a large sum in gold. They then threw the bodies into the Danube. The officers were charged with anti-Bolshevik propaganda.

The third man executed was Ladislav Szamuel, who was the third of three wealthy brothers, who were affiliated with the communists. The other two brothers committed suicide.

Ladislav has a unique history. As a judge he kept an express train of three cars waiting constantly at the depot, so that whenever occasion arose he could proceed through Hungary to condemn to death anti-Bolsheviks. There were 42 illegal executions charged against him, the exact number for which he was responsible will never be known.

The executions took place in the snow-covered courtyard of the prison at Budapest, where crowds of friends, relatives and curious-minded gathered. There were several hundred civilians and officers within the courtyard and many crowded watching. They were for the most part sufferers from the Bolshevik regime; so they came not as idlers, but with grip faces to see justice done.

It is estimated that the Bolsheviks executed more than 600 of those who opposed them. Six hundred and forty terrorists are now waiting trial.
