The minutes of Executive Meetings held since last annual meeting were read and approved, after which the report of the Corresponding

Greetings were also received from St. Peter's Church Woman's Missionary Society, Toronto, through Miss Paul. A letter was also read from the Diocesan Branch of the Woman's Auxiliary to Domestic and Foreign Missions (Episcopalian), expressing the cordial sympathy and interest of their President and Secretary in the work of this Society.

Questions were presented at this stage of the proceedings, and interesting discussion had on several points connected with the work; at the conclusion of this conversation, it was moved and seconded that,—Whereas great dissatisfaction is felt by the members of this Society at the lack of information existing concerning the work in some of the Missions assisted by our funds, be it resolved that each institution under the care of this Society be requested to furnish quarterly

reports.—Carried.

The convention then adjourned, Rev. Dr. Hunter pronouncing the enediction.

At the evening meeting, Rev. Dr. S. J. Hunter presided.

The address of welcome was given by Mrs. W. J. Hunter, and responded to by Mrs. W. E Ross, of Montreal. Suitable hymns were sung, and a very instructive address followed by Rev. C. S. Eby, D.D.

A solo was rendered by Mrs. W. E. Ross, of Montreal, after which Mrs. L. Youmans gave an earnest and practical address.

The doxology was sung and the benediction pronounced.
