Over 400 of the 2,800 babies born in Hamilton during the year 1915 have died. The conditions under which these babies lived and the causes for their deaths will be especially sought after by nurses and entered on the schedules. The facts and figures received from such inquiries will, it is expected, throw considerable light on the appalling and still mystifying fact that out of every 1,000 babies born in Ontario 102 die in their first year.
