LOYD GEORGE TO THE PRESS MEN
He Quotes Lincoln's Words as To When the War Will End

David Lloyd George spoke on May 8 at the annual dinner for the London Press Fund. He arrived late, just in time to make his address before the company separated. It was not a joyous banquet. The sinking of the Lusitania filled every mind and most people expected the chancellor to refer to that news, but he did not and it was said that he deliberately refrained from making any allusion to the tragedy. His audience derived the impression that, as one present put it, "official reticence at the moment and until all the facts are known best bestrided a British minister, for the true word in this matter rests with America."

Many outbursts of applause marked this, one of the most ringing speeches Lloyd George has made in his whole career. His reference to the Infantes perpetrated by Germany in the course of the war was greeted with particular applause, for the sinking of the Lusitania was felt to be perhaps the most wanton and inexcusable of all.

Although he made no direct reference to the United States, the chancellor gave an American flavor to his speech by reference to Dr. Demburg's explanations to the American people and by the following parallel:

"In this war it is the nation that endures to the end that will win. How long will the war last? That is a question asked me repeatedly. That question was put to Abraham Lincoln in another war, full of triumph, full of vicissitudes, full of moments of depression. When will this war end? said some one to him, and his answer was, 'We accept this war for an object, a worthy object, and it will end when it is attained.'"


"That must be the sentiment of every true Britisher today. Under God, I hope it will never end until that time comes."

He said the freedom of Europe from the Prussian mania to dominate the world was the allies' chief aim.
