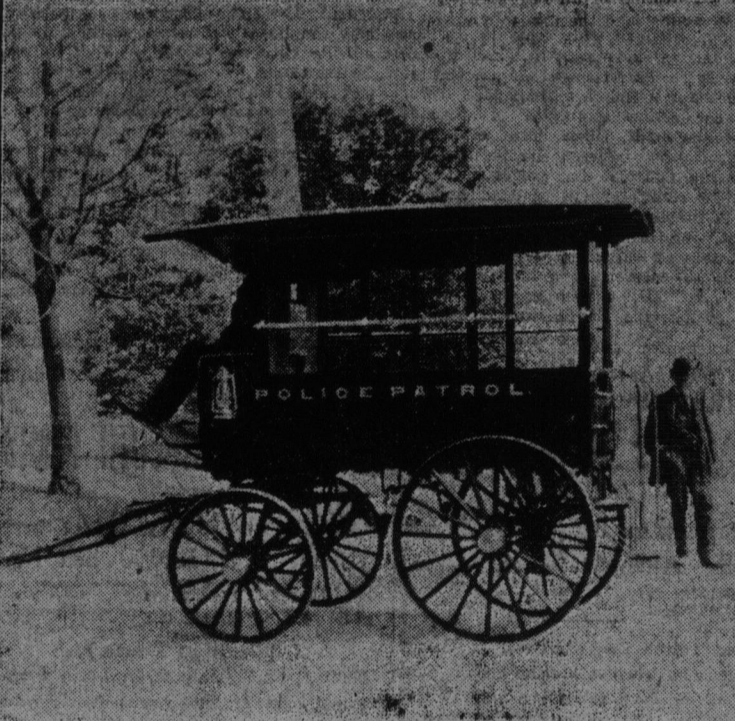

Family Notes of Men Who Have Received Coronation Honors—Lord Rosebery and the Right to Name of Midlothian

Lord Colebrooke has just been appointed by King George, captain and commander of the corps of Grenadier Guards, in succession to Lord Denman, who has been obliged to give up the office on his departure for Australia, where he is succeeding Lord Dudley as governor general of the commonwealth.

A Village Without Clocks

Lord Rosebery
Appropos of the honors conferred at the time of King George's coronation, it may be added that Lord Rosebery will continue to bear the name and title under which he has become so widely known, as former prime minister of England, and as winner of the Derby on two occasions.

Favorite of the King
That Lord Colebrooke holds, as high a place in the regard of King George V. as the did in that of Edward VII., is shown by the fact that he has been until now one of the present king's lords in waiting, and that he has now been promoted to the high-sounding post of commander of the corps of gentlemen-at-arms, which carries with it a salary of \$7,000 a year and all sorts of prerogatives.

Mr. Ezra J. Lindsay, who died at the age of 72, was a native of St. John, N. B., and was for many years a member of the House of Commons, and afterwards ambassador to Turkey, and Lord Colebrooke's grandfather was famous as a Sanskrit scholar, and spent thirty years in India.
