HOPE TO DRIVE LEPROSY FROM THE WORLD

New York, Jan. 10.—Hope for the eradication of leprosy from the world was expressed at a meeting of the American Mission to Lepers, yesterday, due to the success of a new treatment involving the use of ethyl ester, a product of Chaulmoogra oil, and an increasing interest everywhere in the stamping out of the disease.

The ethyl ester derivative of chaulmoogra oil, discovered a few years ago by Prof. A. L. Dean, a chemist of the University of Hawaii, is manufactured by distilling the fatty acids of the oil and adding camphor and resorcin. It is given to the patients hypodermically. At the present time 4,000 patients in the Philippines are doing well under the new treatment, according to a report, which says that in other hospitals in the Far East, similar results are obtained.

JURY SAYS DEATH WAS ACCIDENTAL

A coroner's jury last evening inquiring into the circumstances attending the death of Harry Baker, who was killed in the C. P. R. yards at West St. John on January 5, failed to show the cause of the unfortunate man's death. The fatality was described as accidental and no blame was attached to any one. Coroner F. L. Kenney, in addressing the jury, said that he could not understand how Baker could have walked into an approaching train without being seen by some members of the train crew or switchman. Eight witnesses were examined last night. They were: J. E. Allingham, C. P. R. yard foreman; George W. Donner, a switchman; Robert Beattie, trainman; James Lawson, trainman; Charles T. Keating, conductor; E. L. Kaine, engineer; I. E. Ward, fireman and W. P. Monahan, yard master for the C. P. R.

NOTED SLUMS OF GLASGOW WILL BE WIPED OUT SOON

Glasgow, Dec. 12.—(By Mail).—The famous river tenement district of Glasgow, which has long had the reputation of being the most squalid in the world, is to be entirely wiped out. As the buildings were in danger of collapse, the city authorities ordered the tenants to vacate, and have approved plans to have the slum houses torn down. The district will not be rebuilt, but new municipally-owned houses are being erected in the suburbs to care for the hundreds of homeless of the poorer classes.

The finance committee of the Municipal Council met yesterday afternoon and further considered estimates for the General Public Hospital. They now stand at \$117,462.25. Some details

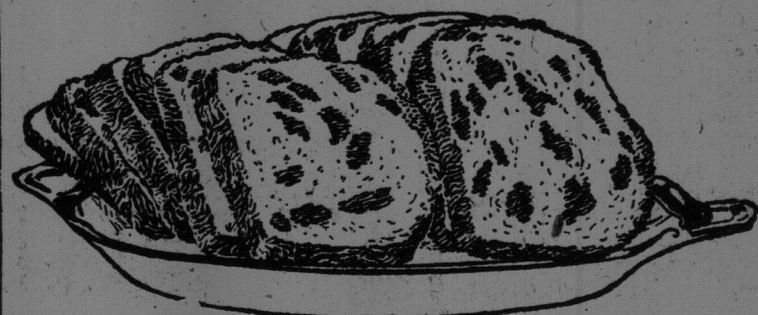
