

Adjourned till 4 o'clock.

Met in accordance with appointment.—Prayer by the Moderator.
The Circular Letter was read and adopted.

Resolved, That bro. Nutting superintend printing the Minutes, and that 900 copies be printed.

Resolved, That bro. J. E. Bill be our Messenger to the N. B. Association, and that he receive £5 for his services.

Resolved—That the annual meeting this year be held at Newport, on the first Sabbath after the 20th September, and that a similar meeting be held at Onslow the week following.

Resolved—That the monthly concert of prayer for the heathen, be recommended to be observed in our churches.

Resolved—That the former officers of the Missionary Board be continued.

Resolved—That brother Pryor prepare a resolution expressing the respect of the Association for the memory of our late lamented brother, James Munro.

Resolved—That the next Association be held at Liverpool on the first Monday after the 20th June, and that bro. T. S. Harding preach the introductory sermon, and in case of failure, bro. Burton.

Resolved—That bro. J. Chase, write the Circular Letter.

Resolved—That in the absence of the Treasurer, brethren A. V. Dimock, J. Chase, and A. Marshall, receive the monies to be paid in aid of Domestic Missions at eight o'clock to morrow morning.

Resolved—That it be earnestly pressed upon the attention of the respective churches, ministers and members connected with this Association, to carry into effect the resolutions which were formerly passed in favor of Sabbath Schools, and for forming a general union to effect the all important objects of those institutions; and that, inasmuch as the report made by the Committee appointed in 1837, for forming such union, was not carried into effect at our last Association—therefore, that bro. John Chase be added to such committee, and that they do take measures as soon as possible to proceed with the duties imposed on them by such appointment.

The condition of the colored people in the vicinity of Halifax, having been brought to the notice of the Association, by several brethren personally acquainted with their wants, Resolved therefore, that the Clerk do address a letter to them assuring them that the Association deeply feel for their condition, and will aid them as soon as in their power, and that the subject be now referred to the Missionary Board. A collection was then taken towards affording them missionary aid, which amounted to £7 12s.

The committee appointed at the last Association to address an appeal to the churches of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, on the subject of the establishment of a Foreign Mission, and the increase of home missionary operations, having prepared such appeal, the same was read, and it is therefore

Resolved—That the same be printed in the Christian Messenger.
