15 they announce the largest regular income the Society has ever received. The entire receipts of the year amount to £130,438 7s. 10d. From this, however, must be deducted £1,712 17s. 9d., additional contributions to the Jubilee and China Funds, leaving £128,725 10s. 1d., as the year's receipts from ordinary sources being £4,247 0s. 7di, in excess of the previous year.

The issues of the Society have surpassed those of any former year, reaching the unprecedented number of 1,474,394.

The increase of circulation, as compared with the last year, amounted to 23,518 copies.
