

## GERMAN PRISONERS PARDONED

Berlin, Aug. 5.—The Kaiser today pardoned all prisoners in German jails except those held for felony, and ordered their immediate release. To feed the women and children whose husbands and fathers have enlisted in the army the Federal Council today appropriated \$1,500,000.

## UNVEILING OF CARTIER STATUE IS POSTPONED.

Montreal, Aug. 5.—The unveiling of the statue to Sir George Cartier and the celebration of the Cartier centenary, which had been set for September, will not take place until the close of the war. The statue is held up in Antwerp, owing to the war conditions.

## GERMAN RAVAGES

Paris, Aug. 5.—The French customs and telegraph offices at Homecourt and Joux in Meurthe-et-Moselle have been sacked by German infantry, according to despatches received here. At Morfontaine, a German officer was taken prisoner when the French infantry repulsed a party of German cavalry.

## AROUND THE FUR RANCHES.

"The Caledonia Fur Farms Limited" is the title of another fur-raising company that is being organized in Prince Edward Island. Among the recent arrivals in Charlottetown who are interested in the fox business is Mr. H. D. Buchanan, a former associate editor of "The Busy East," a magazine that does much to further the interests of the Maritime Provinces, and has paid special attention to the fox industry. Mr. Buchanan, it is understood, intends opening a fox investment exchange in St. John, New Brunswick. The development of the fox industry in that province is becoming so great that no doubt there will be ample scope for such a business as Mr. Buchanan will undertake.

Opinions of "Fur Farming in Canada" as entertained in England.

"Fur-farming in Canada" is the subject of an article in the latest issue of the "Bulletin of the Imperial Institute, London, which is a quarterly record of progress in tropical agriculture and industries." The article being inspired by the report of the committee on Fisheries, Game and Fur-bearing animals, of the Commission of Conservation.

"Up to the present time" says the reviewer, "most of the work on fur-farming has been done in the Maritime Provinces, but it is developing rapidly in Ontario and Quebec, and isolated fur-farms exist throughout the Western Provinces. The most important work accomplished so far is that of rearing foxes in captivity, attention being paid chiefly to the dark or so-called silver foxes on account of the great value of the skins. Attempts have been made for a number of years past to rear valuable black or silver foxes in captivity, but the experiments of Dalton and Oulton on Prince Edward Island are chiefly responsible for the establishment of this industry on its present successful basis."

After describing the method of fox ranching and mentioning the prices obtained for breeding pairs and also for skins, the article concludes: "The fox-breeding industry is at present in a very speculative condition, but there seems little doubt that it should prove very remunerative if carried on a fair scale under intelligent management."

The majority of the raw furs are in the hands of European dealers who report a very slow market and prices materially lower than one year ago. Local manufacturers have made up their sample lines and are buying goods on a hand to mouth basis waiting for orders from the jobbers. Things are unusually quiet in the fur trade for this season of the year.

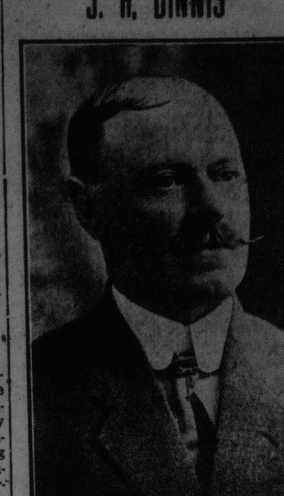
