## ADDRESS TO THE SOCIETY.

DEAR BRETHREN :- Being assembled in Annual Concernce, we have with great pleasure the opportunity of addressing to you a few to ds of consolation, information, and exhortation; gratefully acknowledging the good hand of the Lord, who has sustained and conducted us invariant and crowned us with many blessings, temporal and spiritual, during the change used conflicts of the past year. None of your information have been called from the cares, labours and sufferings of this world, to their rest and reward in Heaven.

The great Head of the Church has not left us without the s of His love, and has poured His Holy Spirit upon us, to ther, to revive an exactify our souls; so that after filling up the losses occasioned by unfaithfulness, removals and deaths, we have an increase of 298 persons meeting with us in Church fellowship.

Several Societies and Congregation have given evidence of love to the habitation of God's house, in cleaning, repairing, and also in lessening the debts thereon; others in building suitable places of worship, so that His cause may be established and built up; Christ honoured, and souls saved. We, however, learn with grief and sorrow of heart, that several in our Societies seldom attend their class meetings, their prayer meetings, or the public means of grace, and do but little any way to premote the welfare of the Church, and the extension of the Reedeemer's kingdom in the world. In many places our Societies consistently take a deep and lively interest in the prosperity of our Sabbath Schools, and we are pleased to state as the result that more than one thousand Téachers and Children have been added to the ranks during the year. We regret, however, that so many do not see and feel how important this department is to the Church, nor render that sympathy and aid necessary to the attainment of its proper character, and the fulfilling of its mission, as the hope of the Church and the world.

The Finance Department, both the General and Missionary, are in advance of last year; and we affectionately suggest to you the propriety of considering the necessity and importance of continuing your increasing liberality, that the cause of Christ may continue to advance and prosper.
