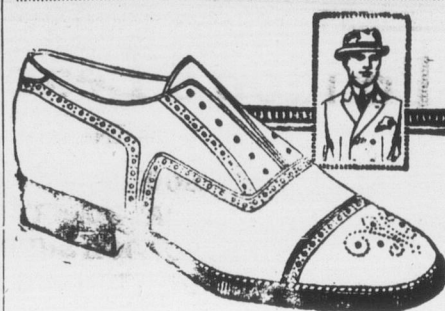

Mr. A. Lorde of Owen Sound, Mr. and Mrs. Thompson and family of Kitchener were recent visitors in the city.

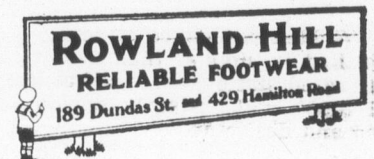
