#### LOCAL

Ekfrid council meets on Wednesday, June 16.

The next legal holiday is Thursday, July 1st, Dominion Day.

A drive into the country these days is one of the delights of life.

The June session of Middlesex county council opened at London on Monday.

The cut worm is said to be damaging spring crops in some districts in Middlesex.

The Longwoods Road is being graded and otherwise improved through Ekfrid.

Glencoe Bowling Club has been organized for the season with a fairly large membership.

Markets—wheat \$1.25, oats 50c, barley 70c, butter 23c, eggs 18c, hogs \$9 to \$9.15, potatoes a bag 50c.

One mill on the dollar, as a war tax, will be collected on all rateable property in Middlesex for this year.

The Ladies' Aid of Bethel Church will hold their annual garden party on Tuesday evening, June 20. Watch for bills.

The Women's Institute are holding a garden party on the Town Hall grounds at Alvinston on Wednesday evening, June 16.

Rev. W. G. Howson will preach the sermon at an anniversary service to be held by the Oddfellows of West Lorne next Sunday afternoon.

Smallpox outbreaks in the county several months ago will cost the county over \$500; Moss township, \$140, and North Dorchester, \$124.

M. C. Campbell, customs collector, we regret to say is in poor health and has been compelled to relinquish the duties of his office for a season.

The young people of Pratt's Siding purpose holding a lawn social on the school grounds there Wednesday, June 23rd, in aid of the Patriotic Fund.

The annual meeting of the Church of Christ in Moss will be held on Sunday, June 13th, at 11 a.m. and 5 p.m., conducted by the Rev. T. L. Fowler.

Brookside Farmers' Club held a picnic on the fair grounds at Alvinston on Wednesday of last week, which was attended by about a thousand people.

Austrian and Russian laborers working on a drain near Alvinston got into a scuffle and were taken before the local magistrate for disturbing the peace.

Mr. Britton, of London, formerly manager of the Merchants Bank at Glencoe, underwent a critical operation at one of the London hospitals recently.

Farmers who are well stocked with cattle will be pleased with a prediction made that good beef will be selling at 9 cents a pound, live weight, by the first of August.

During the ball game at the park on Tuesday evening C. McNaughton, of the Glencoe team, while at bat was struck in the face by a pitched ball, fracturing his nose in three places.

Workmen digging in Milwaukee uncovered a tin can that had \$5,000 in gold coins in it. This ought to encourage gardeners to go ahead and dig out more great holes in the back yard.

Clinton Keach, of Thamesville, had both legs severed when he jumped off the eastbound local freight train on the Grand Trunk at Thamesville Wednesday afternoon. He died a few hours later.

We gather from the war news that Germany has bitten off more than she can chew. The food reports from Berlin, however, indicate that Germany could chew a lot more than she is able to bite.

John Henry has returned from a trip to Alaska, Sask. He reports crop prospects for the West are exceedingly good, and particularly so in the Alaska section. East of Winnipeg there is a lack of rain, and thousands of acres have been burnt over this spring in Northern Ontario.

Chas. T. Pearce, formerly with the Traders Bank at Glencoe and subsequently manager of the Toronto News, has been engaged to manage the Toronto business of McKim & Co.'s advertising agency.

The business men of Glencoe have unanimously agreed to close their shops on Wednesday afternoon of next week from one to five o'clock on occasion of the semi-jubilee picnic of the Presbyterian church.

Glencoe defeated Melbourne in a lively game of baseball at the park on Tuesday evening. Score 11 to 4. Batteries—Melbourne, Graham and Cook; Glencoe, Cleve Watterworth and Pete Leitch. The boys would like to see a larger attendance of the public at their games.

An attractive souvenir pamphlet containing an interesting historical sketch and illustrations has been issued to mark the semi-jubilee of Glencoe Presbyterian church. These are now on sale at Scott's drug store, and as the edition is limited you should get them early for yourself and friends.

There was a big raising at John McVicar's, Ferguson's Crossing, on Saturday afternoon, when the timbers for a frame barn and shed were raised. It is estimated that about a thousand people were present, including women and children. The captains were Wm. June and A. J. Purcell and the sides finished about even.

Mission sermons will be preached in St. Matthew's church, Alvinston, daily this week at 3 and 7:15 p.m. His Lordship Rt. Rev. M. F. Fallon, D. D., Bishop of London, will deliver the address at the closing exercises next Sunday, and the choir of St. Peter's Cathedral, London, will render the musical vespers in the evening.

Observation towers are being erected at several points throughout Western Ontario by the Dominion Government for military purposes. They will be about ninety feet in height and will be constructed of concrete and steel. Being on elevated positions they will command a good view of the surrounding country for a distance of some twenty miles.

Mr. and Mrs. John Secord, of Moss, received another letter on Saturday from their son George, who is a member of the Third Field Ambulance Corps with the first Canadian Contingent. George was at the front in some of the severest battles in which the Canadian troops were engaged and gives an interesting pen picture of the dreadful carnage at Ypres and Langemark. He had many narrow escapes.

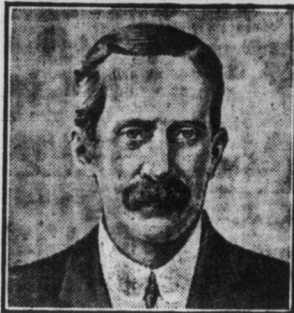
Following is the prize list for sporting events at the picnic to be held on Agricultural Park, Glencoe, Wednesday, June 16:—
