FREDERICTON, TUESDAY, 29th JANUARY, 1805.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY having been Prorogued to this Day, then to meet for the dispatch of Business, when, a sufficient number of Members not attending the House, was further Prorogued to MONDAY next, the 4th Day of FEBRUARY:

PRAYERS.

THE HOUSE having this Day met according to the Prorogation, the Clerk of the Crown returned the Writ for the Election of a Member for the County of *Saint John*, when it appeared that *Munson Jarvis*, Esquire, was duly Elected—And also the return of the Writ for the Election of a Member for the County of *Westmorland*, when it appeared that *Titus Knapp*, Esquire, was duly Elected.

ORDERED, That *Mr. Gilbert* and *Mr. Wilson* attend to see the said Members qualified before the Commissioner appointed for that purpose, and having attended accordingly, Reported, that *Munson Jarvis* and *Titus Knapp*, Esquires, had taken the usual Oaths—**THEREUPON ORDERED**, that they take their Seats.

MESSAGE was received from His Honor the **PRESIDENT**, requiring the attendance of this House in the Council Chamber.—The House attended accordingly, and being returned—**READ** the first time “A Bill for incorporating a Public Grammar School in the City of *Saint John*.”

Mr. Speaker then Reported, that “The House had attended His Honor the **PRESIDENT** in the Council Chamber, when he was pleased to make a Speech to both Houses, and that to prevent mistakes he had procured a Copy of the same, which he read to the House,” and is as follows, to wit:
