1st—A combined concrete dam and railway bridge with necessary connections.

2nd—For all the work to be constructed, viz., the combined concrete dam and railway bridge, together with a power house and tall race.

The work includes the construction of a power house 108 feet by 30 feet, on concrete foundation; the furnishing and erecting of the steel, iron and expanded metal required in the construction of the power house and dam (with the exception of the superstructure of the railway bridge); and of the timber in the platforms, aprons, stop logs and crib work; together with the necessary excavations, &c.

## Tenders for CONCRETE SIDEWALKS

Sealed tenders addressed to the undersigned and marked on envelope, "Tender for Sidewalks," will be received up till noon on the

16th of May Next,

for the construction of 50,000 square feet of Concrete Sidewalk in the City of Windsor between May 15th and September 15th, 1902, of such widths and at such places as may be named by the Public Works Committee of the council and according to specifications to be obtained at my office. Each tender to be accompanied by a certified cheque on some chartered Canadian bank for the sum of \$500.00 and payable to the city treasurer, which, in the case of the unsuccessful tenderers, will be returned as soon as a contract is awarded, but in the case of the successful tenderer will be retained until a satisfactory agreement and bond is executed for the fulfilment of the contract, and in the event of such successful tenderer for any reason neglecting or refusing for 10 days to execute such agreement, said cheque will be cashed and the difference between his tender and the next lowest, together with the cost of the re-advertising and any other expenses incidental thereto, retained by the city and the balance returned.

Payment for the work will be made from time to time once a fortnight according to the following scale, that is to say .80 per cent. of the work finished, the remaining 20 per cent. to be retained by the city till May 1, 1903, at which last mentioned date, if the work is in perfect condition, or so soon thereafter as the same may be put into perfect condition, one-half of said 20 per cent. retained will be paid over, and on the 1st of May, 1904, if all the work be in perfect condition, the remaining 10 per cent. will be paid over.

Also, at the same time, and in all respects under the same conditions as above provided in regard to sidewalks, tenders will be received for about 3,000 lineal feet of
