

Egg Bread.—Take one pint of fine, white Indian corn meal; mix into a smooth batter with warm water. Add three well-beaten eggs, a spoonful of salt, two table-spoonfuls of melted lard. Bake in a shallow pan, and just before placing in the oven pour a gill of warm water or milk on the top of the mixture. It requires more heat to bake Indian meal than flour.

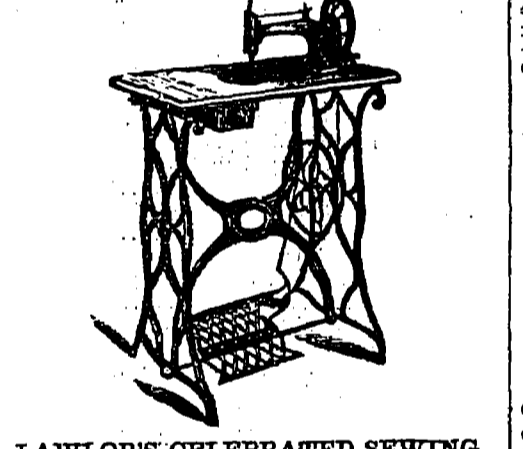
