HETHERINGTON, THOMAS, J. P. (*Queen's.*)

S. of Richard Hetherington, from Cumberland, Eng B. in Johnston, Queen's Co., N. B. M., 28 March, 1860, Violet D. Thorne. Is a merchant and a farmer; a J.P. and a Parish Court Commr. First returned to the Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at g.e. 1886 and 1890—the latter by acclamation. A Liberal of the old school, and favours Independence and Free Trade.—*Thorne Town, Johnston, N.B.*

HIBBARD, GEORGE FRANKLIN. (*Charlotte.*)

S. of the late Hon. Francis Hibbard, who represented Charlotte Co. in the Leg. Assem., N.B., for several years, and was subsequently appointed a mem. of the L.C., which position he held up to the time of his death in 1880. B. in St. George, N.B., 17 April, 1848. Ed. at the Grammar Sch. there. M. 30 April, 1878, Miss Julia Etta Breed, of Charlestown, Mass., U.S. Has been a Co. Councillor of the Municipality of Charlotte for two years. Is Past Master of St. George Lodge, No. 12 F. & A.M. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at g.e. 1886 and 1890. An Independent.—*St. George, N.B.*
