

In table C the various religious denominations of Canada are represented by the following proportions per thousand of the population: Roman Catholics, 412·2; Church of England, 133·7; Presbyterians, 156·2; Methodists, 175·6; Baptists, 62·9; Lutherans, 13·2; Other Denominations, 27·7, and Not Specified, 18·5.

The places of birth of the people are given in table D, the proportion per 1,000 being: Born in Canada, 866·0; in Great Britain and Ireland, 99·0; in other British Possessions, 2·6; in the United States, 16·8; in Germany, 5·8; in Scandinavia, Poland and Russia, 3·6; in China, 1·9; in France, 1·1; in Other Countries, 2·5; at Sea, 0·1, and Unknown, 0·7.

In table E the place of birth of the father per 1,000 is: Canada, 639·4; Great Britain and Ireland, 298·9; Other Countries, 61·7. Place of birth of mother: Canada, 688·2; Great Britain and Ireland, 254·2; Other Countries, 57·6.

Table F gives the population of cities, towns and villages, with ratios, for the years 1881 and 1891; also a statement showing, by provinces, the movement of population. According to this statement the population of Canada was divided as follows:—

In table G the ages of the people are given, year by year, from one to five, and above five by groups of years, with their ratios. The population of Canada is also divided into seven classes of ages in the following order:—
