In reply to your wire of the 17th.instant
I beg to say that I have interviewed Mr S.E.Dafoe and he
is prepared to accept the position of Clerk in connection
with Crop-Share Agreements, commencing August 15th.
I am glad the Department is prepared to employ Mr Dafoe again
for this workthis year as he is competent and familiar with
the work. Crops are light and harvest will be early owing to
extreme heat and lack of moisture. However, there is every
indication of a big increase in price over last year.

Transportation for Mr. Dafoe must be considered as daily inspection over a large area is necessary and 60 miles a day on this work is not an unusual drive. On this work I would recommend that Mr Dafoe use the Ford Tudor driven by me for the last three years and that authority to purchase a new car for my use be granted. My work requires a car at all times and although I have driven the Ford over 30,000 miles it is still in good order and would do very well for Mr Dafoe. The replacement is a fair charge against Band Funds I believe. I mentioned this point to Dr. McGill when he was here and mentioned the fact that I was under the impression that the car supplied to me has always been purchased from Band Funds.

I may say that the FORD, Chevrolet and ESSEX
Terraplane cars can all be purchased less discount secured
on Government purchases and there is very little difference
in the cost of these cars. All of them are now built to suit
persons with long legs and they are a good deal more confortable than the old Fords. I hope that authority will be granted
to replace before August 15th so that a car will be available
for Dafce at that time. Without a car, neither he nor I can
carry out our work.
