In the other it is calling on the brown in fact to increase the duna ofils appropriation for the Indians by the Remarked of one Seventh of the tract originally Set apart for their occupation, With regard to the Grown Reserves the Committee are of Opinion home oughe to be made out of the tract, because it was not intended that the brown Should derive any advantage from the transac tion; but they think the reservation for the blergy rests on a different footing; it is a quasi tay on the disposition of the property which ought to be borne by the parts for whose benefit the fale takes place not by the brown which has no benefi Cial interest in the transaction.
