and the course of training will be for a period of three months.

The Department of Immigration makes no contribution towards the passage of trainees.

## 'Teen Age Boys.

The Select Standing Committee on Agriculture and Colonization also approved of all previous efforts to promote and encourage 'teen age immigration from Great Britain and recommended that the age limit for boy immigrants be extended to boys 14 to 19 years of age, both inclusive.

The Department of Immigration invited Provincial
Governments to co-operate in the reception, distribution and
placement of British boys. These boys are selected by the
Oversea Representatives of the Dominion or Provincial
Governments and are brought forward to the Provincial
reception and distributing centres which are under the
direct supervision of the Provincial Governments.

Under date of the 3rd November 1928 arrangements
were made with the Provincial Government to use the Agricultural
College and equipment at Saskatoon as the reception and
distributing centre for the Province of Saskatchewan.

During the spring of 1929, 57 boys were recruited by the
Overseas Agents of the Department of Immigration and brought
forward to the Agricultural College at Saskatoon for placement
under the auspices of the Saskatchewan Government.
