

and that it contains Pine and  
Hemlock.

Mr. McKay also reports as regards  
the adjoining lot, No 2, Con 12,  
which was taken up by Robert  
Conolly in 1882, with Lot No 1, that  
there are "no improvements,  
"unoccupied and unfit for cultiva-  
"tion, also contains Pine and Hemlock."  
Since the receipt of your letter  
Mr. McKay has called at the  
Department and has stated his  
willingness to swear to the cor-  
rectness of his report.

It has already been explained  
to you that the reason why the Patent  
was issued for Lot 1, was in conse-  
quence of an affidavit of settlement  
on the Lot having been filed and
