Sir.

With reference to your letter of the 7th instant, in which you state that the heirs of the late Louis Nagazon are anxious to receive their respective shares of his estate, I have to inform you that you should ascertain and state definitely the name of each heir. In your letter of the 27th April, 1905 you mentioned certain persons names and said you had been teld they were the heirs. Such information is too indefinite, for the Department to act upon.

I have also to direct your attention to your letter of the 6th ultimo, regarding the respective amounts which for the reasons therein stated should be retained out of J.B. Nagazoa's share of the estate when in distribution of the same is being made. It is necessary for you to inform the Department of the actual amount which he received from William Pauquette in the winter of 1905-4 for rent of house.

Rindly give these matters your immediate attention. Full information on the points mentioned is required before division of the estate can be made.
