least prepared for such negotiation.

I had hoped the higher brass taken
us to England with him but
perhaps that was not possible. I
know I could do him some good for

we managed to avoid some diplomatic
snarls when we were together before,
and I had a list to do with keeping
him on the right track. Anyway I
hope he will take us on when
he gets back and really gets to work.

In the other connection I will write
to Mr. Howes again today.

I do hope the Department will do
something definite and soon about
an announcement to adhere to the Defense
& Mobilization scheme. I am continuing
to look after on the militia resulting
from the rumors that I spoke of.

Again many thanks for your kind letter.
Maintaining our fighting the Air Force. I do
hope you will be able to get a list of a
holiday, down from us all. Charles.
