A. Cpl. Burgard. He is in charge of those three sections. There were other Gunners but I can't recall their names.

CROSS EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER

- Q.118 Did you, at any one time, previous to when Gnr. Lecompte was struck by Bdr. Waterfield, lay a hand on him?
- A. No. sir.
- Q.119 Did you see Bdr. Daniels hit him?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q.120 How many times?
- A. I would may about a couple.
- Q.121 Before Bdr. Waterfield struck him?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q.122 Was the fact mentioned at any time that the accused should be taken to the M.I.R.?
- A. No, sir. They took him in when we got to the Guard Room.
- Q.123 You three fellows made no attempt?
- A. No, we thought it was only a nose bleed.

 FROSECUTOR DECLINES TO RE-EXAMINE

 QUESTIONED BY THE COURT
- Q.124 Do you know Edr. Daniels and Edr. Waterfield pretty well?
- A. Yes, I have known them ever since I came here.
- Q.125 Who did you consider was senior of the three of you?
- A. Well, I was the oldest N.C.O. there, sir.
- Q.126 I think you said some place in the evidence that two were hanging on Bdr. Waterfield's neck. Who were the two?
- A. Col. Richmond and Gmr. Lecompte.
- Q.127 When did Bar. Daniels hit him? What stage of the scuffle?
- A. Right at the first when I walked in after he and Cpl.
 Richmond had started. They were in the scuffle when I
 welked in and Bdr. Deniels just came in.
- Q.128 Did you see Bdr. Daniels hit him?
- A. Yes, sir. He had his head under his arm.
- Q.129 You were in a good position to see the fight in the hall?
- A. Yes, I was the only one there except he and Waterfield.
- Q.130 Could you give us a blow by blow description?
- A. It was all over tefore I knew it. He just hit Waterfield and Waterfield just hit him.
