Mercantile Summary.

THE People's Bank of Halifax has opened an
agency at Shediac, N. B.

THE new schooner "Evolution," built at
Spencer's Island, N. S., has just finished load-
ing at Port Williams, N. S., for Havana. Her
cargo consists of 2,500 bbls. of potatoes.

HEAVY rains last week caused a land slide
near the Chemainus saw mills, in B. C., and
almost buried the engine of that mill, besides
washing away about 500 feet of the flume.

VESSEL charters of Monday last were: For
deals, ship "Annie Bingay," and barque
"Katabdin," Bristol Channel, 62s; ship
"Bonanza," for West coast England, 60s 6d.
—all to load at St. John.

KINGSTON shows an increase of about a
thousand in population this year as compared
with last. She now has 18,284 according to
the assessors. Some two hundred new build-
ings were erected there in the year.

At the annual meeting of the New Bruns-
wick Telephone Co., last Saturday, the old
officers were re-elected. Communication is
being opened between St. John and Frederic-
ton, and St. John and Moncton.

THE directors of the Keystone, a new fire
insurance company launched by St. John
people, met a week ago and elected Sir Leonard
Tilley, president; Mr. C. W. Weldon, M.P.,
vice-president; Mr. Thomas A. Temple,
managing director.

A. McVEAN & SONS, lumbermen and manu-
facturers of spokes, hubs, &c., at Dresden, who
a few months ago had their building and a
large quantity of material destroyed by fire,
have provided new and improved machinery,
which are now being placed in their new
buildings, and they will be in active operation
in about two weeks. Their entire loss will
not exceed \$15,000.
