Province, Passed in the Fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to provide for the erection of a Gaol and Court House, in and for the Home District."

II.—And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid. That the Money so borrowed under the authority of this Act, shall not bear greater Interest than Six Per Centum Per Annum, and that the Treasurer of the said District, for the time being, shall Annually, until the Loan so raised, with the Interest accruing thereon, shall be paid and discharged, apply towards the payment of the same a Sum not less than One Hundred and Fifty Pounds, from and out of the Rates and Assessments coming into his hands, for the use of the District, as aforesaid.

a sum not less than £150 to be applied annually towards the liquidation of the said Loan.

CHAP. V.

AN ACT to provide for ascertaining and establishing the Division Line between the Tour.
ships of Ancaster and Flamborough West, in the District of Gore.

[Passed 13th April, 1825.]

Preamble.

THEREAS, doubts being entertained respecting the Boundary Line between the Townships of Ancaster and Flamborough West, in the District of Gore, it is expedient and proper to have the same ascertained and established: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and Assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America, and to make further Provision for the Government of the said Province." and by the authority of the same, That it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government of this Province, to direct the Surveyor General to cause such Boundary Line to be run out, and ascertained, in conformity with the original Survey of the said Townships.

The Governor &c. to direct the Surveyor General to cause the Boundary line between Ancaster and Flamboro West, to be ascertained.

1.—And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Surveyor General; and he is hereby required, when and as soon as he shall have caused the said Boundary Line to be run out and ascertained, to have certain and permanent Boundaries placed at the governing points thereof; and that the Line so run, ascertained and marked out by the placing of such Boundaries, shall be considered as the permanent and established Boundary Line between the said Townships.

Permanent boundaries to be placed and the governing points and such line to be considered the true line.
