ANOTHER CRISIS NEAR

Huerta's Message To-day Awaited With Anxiety.

United States Officials Fear He May Announce His Candidacy In Coming Presidential Elections—Huerta Government Is Planning an Ovation For Ruler as Parade of Strength.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—Important developments in the Mexican situation are expected here in the next two days. To-day the Mexican Congress assembled and there is a hope of feeling in Washington that President Huerta in his address to that body will make known that he will not become a candidate for the Presidency in the constitutional elections.

There are fears that patriotic fervor may lead to demonstrations against the United States.

However, advice to the State Department are to the effect that efforts of the Huerta Government to make the celebration the occasion for a great patriotic outburst with the object of showing how strongly the people are in favor of the Government are entrenched in the hearts of the people.

It is interpreted to mean that the Mexican people are tired of the continual warfare and will welcome peace. Should the celebration of the holiday take on an aspect of silent disapproval of the Government's course, officials here will be encouraged to believe that the end of the Mexican troubles are in sight and that overtures for a restoration of normal conditions will be welcomed shortly by all factions in the republic.

Should Gen. Huerta publicly announce that he will not be a candidate for President in next month's elections this Government will follow out its course in asking Gen. Huerta to give assurances along the line that has been indicated, and that the Wilson on which ex-Governor John Lind was sent to Mexico by President Huerta has been successful in the normal conditions will be welcomed shortly by all factions in the republic.

IS MADE PROFESSOR. New Associate in Animal Husbandry at O. A. C. Is Wm. Reek.

GUELPH, Sept. 15.—Wm. Reek, B. S. A., has been secured by the Ontario Agricultural College as successor to Mr. W. W. Jones in the associate professorship of animal husbandry; the latter having been appointed to a directorship of the Ontario live stock branch and secretary of the Provincial Winter Fair.

Mr. Reek is a native of Kent County. He graduated from the O. A. C. in the year 1909, and after graduation was secured by the college as demonstrator in physics, applying himself particularly to drainage. From this position he went as private secretary to Mr. C. J. James, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, and when the latter was taken up by the Dominion Government Mr. Reek resigned to become an assistant in the immigration department at London, England.
