And still they're at it! St. John this time with a Fleming banquet! Really the most banquetting one ever heard of and all to what purpose? The modern banquet is of ancient origin. As far back as ancient history records, the banquet has been a recognized institution in the affairs of men. In political time it took upon itself the solemnity of a religious ceremony and according to Darwin had its origin in the habits and customs of the species. These prehistoric ancestors of ours were wont to gather themselves in numbers to eat of the oyster and drink of its milk, and after they had feasted they chattered. It is difficult to analyze at this remote time this chatter, whether it was an effort to speak or an effort to sing. least, in some instances have gone the extreme limit of decency and then some.

Possibly we might take a lesson from this burst of feasting and hilarity from the story of one of old who, coming to that time in his career when he felt himself safely entrenched in his own strength and possessions said to his soul "take thine ease, eat, drink and be merry."
