Tomato Growers Are Asking 60 Cents a Bushel This Year

There is going to be a tussle for a raise in the price of tomatoes the coming season bttween the factories and the growers which not many years ago were contracting for 25 cents a bushel

The growers are holding out for sixty cents a bushel, while the factory managers, at the present time are holding the price at last ytar's-fifty cents. Last season it is claimed, the Dominion Canners paid the sixty cents in Prince Edward County, claiming that the deliveries there are of a

higher average quality down there than in the Niagara district where a percentage of the first grade stuff at the beginning of the season is usually put up in baskets for shipping, while the eastern acreages are taken to the factories intact. So far very few contracts have been signed up at the old price, the growers claiming that the high wages being asked by labor, the increase in the price of fertilizers, manures and plants does not warrant them raising tomatoes at all.
