Three Days Before Death. "Three days before his death Napoleon added a codicil to his will which contained the following legacies:-

"'I bequeath,' he wrote, 'twenty thousand francs to that man, a native of Bocognano, who rescued me from the hands of the brigands who would have assassinated me "'Ten thousand francs to Md Vizza

vona, the only one of that family who belonged to my party. "'One hundred thousand francs M. Jean-Jerome from Levy. "One hundred thousand francs to M. Costa de Bastelica.
