We beg to remind you that som time ago we laid before you a petition, largely signed and voicing the point of all the residents and protion, largely signed and voicing the perty owners in the East End, strong ly protesting against the erection of an "Abattoir" or "Slaughter House" on the proposed site on Water Street, immediately west of the Standard Manufacturing Company, or anywhere within the city limits.

Our burden of smoke and smells and dust is already very heavy, and we pray that you will not add to it by planting in our midst a Slaughter House, for call it an Abattoir or by any other name, it is a slaughter! house pure and simple, where all the killing of animals for food purposes will be carried out, with the attendant sickening odours, myriads of flies and swarms of rats, whilst the idea of having a slaughter house 42 our midst is to us very objectionable. The promoters of the Abattoir
