Fix Minimum Age of Boys at Sea

OTTAWA, Oct. 19.-By proclama tion which will appear in this week's issue of the Canada Gazette, legislation fixing the minimum age for admission of children to employment at sea at 14 years becomes effective as from the first of next January. The legislation also fixes the minimum age for young persons to employment as stoker at 18 years and requires com-pulsory medical examination of child-
