AMERICAN MARKETS.
CHICAGO, Feb. 10.—There was a short-lived attempt to raid the oats pit today, and with it the support, and hand prices suffered in consequence. Otherwise the grain markets were of the commonplace type, with very little of the bearish tendencies. May wheat closed 4c lower. May corn 1/4c to 1/2c down and March 1/2c to 3/4c depressed; provisions, after some activity, closed 1/2c to 3/4c higher. Local receipts of wheat were 17 cars; of corn, 10 cars; and of oats, 10 cars. Duluth reported 365 cars, making a total for the three points of 332 cars, against 339 last week and 607 a year ago. Primary receipts were 502,000 bu., compared with 727,000 bu. a year ago. Seaboard clearances in wheat, 100,000 bushels, 255,000 bu. World's shipments were 8,500,000 bu., compared with 8,200,000 bu. last week and 8,300,000 bu. by last year. Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 30 cars, corn, 110 cars; oats, 10 cars; hogs, 4,000 head.
