TONS OF SUPPLIES FOR MAN IN ARCTIC

Appeal of Harry V. Radford, the Explorer, Answered by Arctic Club of America.

New York, Sept. 21.—In response to an appeal for aid, two tons of supplies have been forwarded to a remote point in the Hudson Bay for Harry Vincent Radford, an explorer, who left here in January, 1799. He intended to wander three years in the frozen north for a study of rare animals and vegetation. The relief supplies have been sent from Montreal under the ausplees of the Arctic Club of America, and are being carried by vessels of the Hudson Bay Company. The provisions include food, clothing, arms and ammunition.

The last word from Mr. Radford was a letter which Anthony Fislal, secretary of the Arctic Club, received a few days ago. Mr. Radford said four companions who had signed contracts to journey from Fort Smith to the Arctic had deserted, and save for one companion, he was travelling alone. The letter was written at Fort Resolution, Great Slave Lake, Northwest Territories, on July 9 last, and Radford said he hoped to reach Chesterfield Inlet the last of September.

"It is a hazardous fight and fraught on every side with danger," said Dr. Hornaday, "and I believe Mr. Radford will come to grief in the undertaking, With only one companion I doubt very much if the explorer will ever reach his destination alive."

Mr. Radford said he would remain at the inlet this winter in a snow honse, with the Eskimos, if the supplies arrived, and would proceed to the Arctic Montreal, Sept. 22. — Melvin Sheppard.
