Rome. Oct. 16.—Halian newspapers allied politically with the parties opposing the present Fascist government, whose daily destinies are at the mercy of the press censor, have addressed a plea to the censor that "he con-demn them quickly if he intends to demn them quickly in he methods to condemn them."
