### Fish for an Invalid

Half a saucerful of water boiling, and place a nice cutlet of fish in a soup plate with a tablespoonful of cold water and a nice piece of butter on the top of the cutlet, and cover with another soup plate. Place this over the boiling water and steam gently for twenty minutes. By cooking it this way you have all the nutriment that the fish contains.

### Crepitantes of Cheese

Four ounces of cheese, three ounces of bread crumbs, one egg, one small onion, pepper, cayenne and salt to taste. Grate cheese and put in a mortar with bread crumbs, onion, pepper and seasoning. Add to a soft paste with enough egg to make a paste, then make in a little balls, flatten out slightly, dip in dry flour, and cook in deep fat (which must be smoking hot before they are put in). When a delicate brown, drain well, and pile in a pyramid, garnish, and serve as quickly as possible.

### iced Fruit Cakes

One cupful of butter, one cupful of sugar, two cupfuls of flour, four large eggs, one teaspoonful of baking powder. Beat the butter and sugar to a cream, add each egg separately. Mix the flour and baking powder and add to the rest of the ingredients, stirring well. Put the paste in thick narrow strips, and cut it round, so as to form a deep cuplike shape; place on a well-buttered tin, and bake. When done, fill with iced fruit, prepared as follows: Take ripe peaches (canned ones will do), cut in dice, dip in white of egg that has been slightly beaten, and then in pulverized sugar, and fill centre of the cakes. Set in the oven until the meringue is nicely browned. Serve with rich cream and coffee.

### THINGS TO KNOW

To poach an egg so that the water does not touch it, put a piece of butter at the bottom of an old teacup, then break in the egg, place the cup in a small saucepanful of boiling water, and in about five minutes the egg will be set. Pass a knife round the sides and slip out on to the toast—this prevents the toast getting damp.

### For Watery Potatoes

When potatoes are likely to be watery, cook in the following way: Score the skin with a sharp knife—not too deeply—then boil in salted water. The incisions made let out the water, and the potatoes are dry and fluffy when cooked.

### Try Grating Your Apples

Line a plate with paste, and then grate in the apples instead of slicing them. This will ensure the fruit being cooked when the paste is done, and it also takes less quantity of apples. Tried with great success.

### Snow-White Tables and Boards

If a kitchen table becomes dirty looking, cut a lemon in two and rub it all over the table. Then rinse well with pure, clean water, and the result will be a smooth and snow-white top. Pasteboards may be treated in the same way.

### Lemon Roly-Poly

Take three-quarters of a pound of flour, six ounces of lard, the juice of one lemon, one teaspoonful of sugar, and one extra teaspoonful of flour. Mix the flour and lard into a smooth paste, and roll it out to the thickness of about half an inch. Squeeze the lemon-juice (strained) into a cup. Stir the teaspoonful of sugar and sugar into the juice, to make a stiff paste. Spread this mixture over the paste and roll it up. Then tie the pudding into a floured cloth. Boil for two hours.

### Stewed Chicken

Take a chicken, cut into joints; put into a stewpan two large onions (chopped fine), four tomatoes, some parsley, a little sage, a few bits of bacon cut small, and salt a cupful of good stock. Stew gently for two hours. Just before dish up, add a wineglassful of sherry.

### Barley Pudding

Take half a pound of pearl barley, well washed; add one quart of new milk, half a pound of refined sugar, and half a nutmeg, grated; then bake it in a deep dish. Remove it from the oven when half cooked, beat up three eggs, mix well together, pour it into a well-buttered dish, and bake again for nearly an hour.

## ALGONQUIN NATIONAL PARK

The Grand Trunk Railway, in view of the very large increased number of winter tourists this season at Highland Inn, in the National Algonquin Park, are making extensive improvements to their Inn.

These improvements will be completed about the 1st of June, and consist of a 165ft. extension to the west wing, which will include some 60 rooms for guests; a music room 80 x 80; tea room, 80 x 80; billiard room, 80 x 80; and a store outfitting department, 80 x 82. This Store Dept. is unique, as it contains everything from a needle to camp equipment. Tourists desiring to make trips through the park, can be supplied with tents, boats, canoes, fishing equipment, supplies and guide the price not exorbitant.

The rotunda is largely increased, also the dining room; necessitating new kitchens, serving-rooms, etc. An additional room for the use of children and nurses, will be built and the guides are to have a separate establishment. With a new ice house, cold storage, enlarged dancing hall, and other alterations referred to will make this Inn one of the most complete and perfect in the lake and mountain parts of Ontario. A large toboggan slide will also be constructed during the summer. During the winter, tourists from all over Canada have made use of the hotel, and the daily average guests from 18 to 25, and it is pleasing to note that most of these guests are from our own and other Canadian Cities.
