PROPOSED BY-LAW

To provide for the issue of "General Consolidated Loan 4 per cent. Debentures" to the amount of \$355,000, for certain permanent improvements and otherwise increasing the efficiency of the Toronto Waterworks.

WHEREAS by an Act passed by the Legislature of the Province of Ontario, in the forty-second year of Her Majesty's reign, and chapter twenty-five, entitled "An Act respecting the Debenture Debt and certain property of the City of Toronto," it is amongst other things enacted that the Corporation of the City of Toronto may pass a By-law or By-laws for authorizing the issue of Debentures in the whole sum of \$3,000,000, to redeem certain outstanding debentures therein specified.

And whereas, the amount of the whole Debenture Debt of the City of Toronto, as at the time of passing of the said Act, was \$2,000,000, and it was further enacted that an increase of the debt by a further issue of debentures might be made when the amount of the said debt should exceed the sum of \$2,000,000, such increase being nevertheless limited to the sum of \$1,000,000.

And whereas, the amount of the whole Debenture Debt of the City of Toronto, as at the time of passing of the said Act, was \$2,000,000, and it was further enacted that an increase of the debt by a further issue of debentures might be made when the amount of the said debt should exceed the sum of \$2,000,000, such increase being nevertheless limited to the sum of \$1,000,000.
