**Big Engines for Hauling Freight.**  
 The first of the large consolidated class of engines for hauling freight, arrived here the other day, and was the object of much interest, to railroad men. They are called the Richmond Compound consolidation engines with four pairs of 63 in. drivers, and, over all, are three feet longer than the large 900 class. The cylinders are 22 1/2 and 35 while the engine and tender, weigh over 350,000 lbs., which is nearly 50,000 heavier than the ordinary class, and are calculated to haul about 400 tons more.  
 They are of an entirely different type from the passenger class, and even the casual observer, not endowed with the knowledge of the expert railroader, readily notes the vast difference. They are being used exclusively for hauling freight, and in the words of an old engineer, "they can deliver the goods, and lots of it."

**LITTLE BELL BIOGRAPHIES**  
**Schubert**  
 FRANZ PETER SCHUBERT, born at Vienna 1797, died 1828, was the greatest song composer of the 19th century. From beginning to end, his short life, though one of incessant activity, was filled with disappointment. He began his musical career in his 11th year as choir-boy in the Imperial Chapel. He began to compose at 15, and from his 16th year wrote in almost every department of music. But his name is celebrated chiefly in the song form, where his genius has no rival. Although he received no instruction in composition, he wrote hundreds of songs of indescribable beauty.  
 It is hard to conceive how the fresh, bright melodies and sweet, natural harmonies of his songs could have come from one who continually suffered from grinding poverty and comparative neglect. Yet they flow from his heart spontaneously—and perfect in the moment of writing. He wrote with such freedom and ease and seemingly so carelessly, that he often did not recognize his own compositions on hearing them. His sparkling and inimitable "Hark, Hark, the Lark" was written in a beer-garden on the bank of a hill-of-fare. And his tenderly beautiful "Serenade" (D min.) has the rare merit of being exceedingly popular and at the same time a delightful number on any high-art programme. But to get the full sensuous effect of his melodies and harmonies they must be rendered from an instrument like
