Mr. Carlton, of India, writes that two families had come out from the heathen and joined a Christian community under his care. They had been reading Christian books, and are intelligent people. Mrs. Chatterjee, has two flourishing girls' schools at Hoshyarpore. One for the Mohammedans contains nearly one hundred girls.

Dodd, of Hangchow, menness. tions in his letter of Aug. 5, the baptism of three persons, and their admission to that church on profession of their faith. Rev. J. Butler, of Ningpo, writes of the uncasy feeling among many native Chris-tians after the massacre of Tientsin, and of their unshaken adherence to the truth. He says, "A week ago vesterday a woman joined the church. While before the session she was asked the question, 'Are you not afraid to join the church now when we hear it said on every hand that we are all going to be killed? Her reply was, ' They may kill the body, but the Lord Jesus will take my soul to Himself.""
