CATILE.—The demand has been active and the supply insufficient. Prices continue very firm, with good butchers' cattle felling at about the same prices as choice export steers. Several car loads offered on Tuesley and sold at 52 to 6c. per pound, averaging 1,000 pounds. Hind quarters of beef are as high as \$10 per 100 pounds, and there is some talk of advancing the retail price to 20c. per pound. The demand for export stock is fain at 6c. to 63c., but few offer. Sheep are searce and firm at 63c., and Spring Lambs solk at \$4 to \$6 a head. Caives in fair supply and steady at \$6 to \$8 a head for those that will dress about 100 pounds. Magrin good demand at 7c. to 73c. with a slight supply.

Cheer is in moderate demand, sales are strictly confined to new at 25c. to 123c. Dried Apples are in rather better domand, with sales of selected at 64c. to 63c. Bacon is firmer, with sales of round lots of clear at 113c., and jobbing lots at 113c. to 12c.; Cumberland out, firm at 104c. for round lots and 104c. to 11c. for small lots.
