tenors of Dalhousie College so far as to express to them the Synod's views and to receive theirs in return, and to report at next meeting of Synod.

The committee on co-operation were directed to act in concert with the movements of the free Church in reference to education so far sour views harmonize. They were appointed a Deputation to want on the Sync.! of the thorch of Scotland during the present week, and should the Synod of the Free Church sect previous to our next session, they were freeted to meet that body also if practicable.

Presbytery of Pictou.

NEW GLASGOW, 2nd July, 1856, Whi a day the Presbytery of Picton met, and was duly constituted with prayer. There sere present, the Rev. A. W. Herdman, Moderator; Alex. Maclean and Allan Pollock, Ministers; Robt. Cullen and Wm. Macdonald, The Rev. Professor George, of Queen's College, Canada, being present, was untied to take a part in the deliberations of the Court. The Presbytery appointed an examination to be held into the state of Macleanen's Mountain Congregation, at their meting, on the first Tuesday of October; that police of the same be given to the Rev. Alex. McGillivray, with a request that he intimate me same on the Sabbath previous. The lists of queries called for by the Synod, were presented, and the Clerk was ordered to draw these up in a condensed form, and lay them on the table, at the meeting of the Court, to be belduring the meeting of Synod. Registers rece produced belonging to the Sessions of New Glasgow and Picton, and were examined. Mr. Maclean stated that, on account of pecular circumstances in his congregation, he could not produce, at this time, all the Registers required. His apology was sustained, and he is ordered to use his utmost endeavor woman Session, and produce all the records excessary before another year. The Presbypry approved of the registers kept by the Session of St. Andrew's Church, Pictou, and edered them to be attested. The same was one with the records of the Session of St. Andrew's Church, New Glasgow; but this Session is ordered to procure a register of keths, in addition to those already kept. A extement was received from James Fraser, by relating to the Presbyterial Fund, the liong Men's Scheme, and the Bible Society; cumined and ordered to be published in the Record. ALLAN POLLOK, Pres.
