Beginning on the Atlantic coast at Halifax the author takes his reader numerous excursions, steadily pursuing his course westward until he lands them by the Fraser Canyons on the Pacific Slope. If any part of the book is better done than another, perhaps it is the sections dealing with Manitoba and its chief city, and the trip over the Rockies. The views in this latter section are noteworthy—The Second Mountain, Beaverfoot and Fraser Canyon, are two pictures specially deserving attention. Altogether this is a book that will commend itself to every candid judgment, and certainly deserves the attention of all who think well of this "Canada of ours."*—The Eastern Chronicle*, New Glasgow, Nova Scotia.
