FINAL ACT OF THE SECOND UNITED NATIONS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CONFERENCE

1. The Second Technical Assistance Conference was convened by the Secretary-General of the United Nations in accordance with the resolution the General Assembly of 12 January 1952, the relevant portions of which read as follows:

"THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

"REQUESTS the Secretary-General,

"(a) Subject to the provisions of any other resolution adopted by the General Assembly, at its sixth regular session, concerning the pledging of extra-budgetary funds, to convene a conference for the purpose of ascertaining approximately the total amount of contributions for the second financial period available from the participating governments subject to the approval of their respective legislative authorities, the execution of the technical assistance programmes of the United Nations and of the specialized agencies:

"(b) To invite to the conference, with the right to vote, all Members of the United Nations and all other States which are members of the specialized agencies participating in the programme; and likewise to invite, without the right to vote, representatives of the specialized

agencies;"

2. The Second Technical Assistance Conference met at the Palais Chaillot, Paris, France, on 6-7 February 1952. The Governments of the follow ing States were represented at the Conference by delegations:
