planning first of all with the Borden commission, to assess our energy sources in so far as their export and domestic use is concerned, then we will be in a position to introduce legislation to establish an energy board and give the resources of Canada not only the co-operation which has not been given them in the past but the opportunity to develop and plan for the future, and we will, as a government, have made the greatest contribution to future generations yet to come. I realize that there are others who wish to exploit particular areas to a point beyond that of which is good for all of Canada. These people are not limited to any one province.

The advantages of an energy board would be, first of all, to assess the wealth that we have in Canada and then to introduce such regulations as would be commensurate with the interests of the provinces and provide long range oil, natural gas, coal and water power policies for the good of our country.
