UNITED NATIONS REPORT ON SATELLITE BROADCASTING

### RESEARCH

RESPONSIBILITY FOR GOVERNMENT SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

Mr. J. Edward Broadbent (Oshawa-Whitby): A question for the Prime Minister, Mr. Speaker. Last Thursday the Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce announced the house would have an opportunity to discuss science policy when the reorganization bill for his department is introduced. Would the Prime Minister assure the house that either in that bill or by some other means there will be a minister responsible for the co-operation of the total government scientific program?

Right Hon. P.-E. Trudeau (Prime Minister): There is a minister responsible for that coordination, Mr. Speaker. It is the President of the Treasury Board. I have indicated that the government is considering making certain changes in that area, but this policy has not yet been approved by the cabinet. Therefore I cannot say when it will be brought before the house.
