## RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION PROGRAMME

Question No. 205—**Mr. Marshall:**

What amount of money has been allocated to each province under the Residential Rehabilitation Programme (NIP) and Rural and Native Housing since its inception?

**Hon. André Ouellet (Minister of State for Urban Affairs):** I am advised by Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows: Loans approved for Residential Rehabilitation since the inception of the program in 1974, are shown in the following table.

## COAST GUARD ON PACIFIC COAST

Question No. 581—**Mr. Reynolds:**

1. Does the Cabinet plan to announce a decision regarding the allocation of departmental responsibility of the Coast Guard on the Pacific Coast and, if so, on what date?

2. Will the Minister of Transport indicate what is the policy with respect to the funding of the Coast Guard Auxiliary, since in Delta, volunteers have already undergone training but are impeded by lack of formulation of policy and fund finances?

**Mr. Ralph E. Goodale (Parliamentary Secretary to President of the Privy Council):** I am informed by the Prime Minister's and Privy Council Offices and Transport Canada as follows: 1. The Coast Guard is the responsibility of the Minister of Transport.

2. It is intended that funding for the Coast Guard Auxiliary will provide reimbursement to members for out-of-pocket expenses, such as fuel, incurred while engaged in rendering assistance at the request of federal rescue authorities. It is proposed to proceed with the formation of the Coast Guard Auxiliary as soon as possible on a national basis. Membership will include the existing members of the Canadian Coast Guard Volunteer Rescue Agent organization as well as other volunteers, mainly small vessel or boat owners, who would make themselves available to help in emergencies. The Canadian Coast Guard will assist with the organization and training of auxiliary units and it is not the intention that auxiliaries would be paid. However, the possibility of providing some form of insurance coverage for individuals and their boats while engaged on rescue operations is being investigated.
