Note: The employment applications (worker registrations) reported for 1977-78 include "revivals"; that is, the number of times the files of previously registered workers were reactivated during the course of that year. This reporting procedure was discontinued in April 1978.

(c) Canada Farm Labour Pools have no responsibility for recruiting foreign workers. This service is provided through the commission's employment and immigration offices.

Based on the number of employment authorizations issued (1102's), some 6,299 foreign workers were placed in agricultural employment in Ontario during 1978, and 6,760 in 1979.\* These totals include renewals of employment authorizations as well as transfers of workers to subsequent employers. Therefore, the actual number of foreign workers admitted to Canada for farm jobs in Ontario was somewhat lower.

\* Foreign worker placements in agriculture are maintained on a calendar year basis.
