The entire programme, however, must be regarded as tentative, and subject to change.

Old students leave Montreal by the R.M.S. "Dorchester" and boy students by the R.M.S. "Montreal" on April 24th. For each group Third Class accommodation has been reserved. Return tickets will be on June 24th for girls from Southampton by the R.M.S. "Empress of Australia" and for boys from Liverpool by the R.M.S. "Montreal" on June 24th.

A limited number will remain in England and join either of the students' groups leaving Montreal on July 2nd by the "Empress of Australia" and "Dorchester" respectively. Particulars regarding these arrangements may be obtained on application to the Liaison Officer.

The present estimated cost is £215 from Montreal and return, but this figure may be slightly amended to meet any changes which may exceptionally be made in the programme.

REPRESENTATION

Provisionally, approximately 500 places have been allocated for Canadian and Newfoundland students as follows:

These are held at the disposal of the Provincial Departments of Education through which allocation of places will be made.

Private schools desiring to be represented should apply directly to the Office of the Overseas Education Liaison: 34 places are available.

It is desired that the names of secondary schools shall be communicated and therefore for the present no school will be allowed more than one place which should be filled in a suggested by the vote of the entire student body in collaboration with the Principal and staff. Each school will be notified by the Department of Education through the usual channels as to whether its representative is to be a girl or boy student. Such students may be over 14 years of age on 1st January, and under 19.

It is further suggested that the student selected should proceed to England on a SCHOLARSHIP, the funds for which would be provided by the school itself, or by such other method as may be determined by these committees. Details and forms may be obtained from the Liaison Officer, who will be glad to assist in any way possible. It is particularly important that the Liaison Officer should be notified if they are eligible to receive the award and the full name, together with the address of the Overseas Education Liaison, in Canada and immediately on arrival in London at 2, Cockspur Street, S.W.1. The number of places available for each country is necessarily limited.
